David Engelman was invited by U.S. Education Secretary Margaret Spellings to attend the Secretary's visit to Columbia in late 2008. There, Secretary Spellings quoted, recognized and thanked Engelman for his public service. On September 24, 2007, Mr. Engelman received the Governor's Order of the Silver Crescent - South Carolina's highest honor for community service, presented on behalf of Governor Mark Sanford by Sheriff Al Cannon. David served as a Loaned Executive to the 2006 Trident United Way Combined Federal Campaign where he raised over \$298,000 in support of local, national, and international health and human service agencies. He has been a Marketing Management coach and judge for South Carolina's DECA Conferences and helped James Island High School's 2002 Marketing Team to a first place win at the state level and 30th in the nation. David judged DECA competitions in 2005, 2006 and 2009. From 1993 to 1996, David Engelman served on 2 sub-committees reporting to Trident's B.E.S.T. (Building Economic Solutions Together) Committee - an initiative undertaken by community leaders to help rebuild the local economy in the wake of Base Realignment and Closure which closed the Charleston Naval Shipyard. David also served as a management representative to the Charleston Naval Complex Labor-Management Committee, working with the South Carolina Employment Security Commission's Dislocated Worker Unit to develop the \$15M Job Training Partnership Act grant awarded by the Department of Labor under U.S. Labor Secretary Robert B. Reich, providing support services and retraining for dislocated workers. Engelman also served on the Mayor's Council on Homelessness and Affordable Housing during that period.
